Peter Flynn to Direct
Limited Engagement Begins October 2nd

Platform Theatre Group (Greg Tully, Producer) will present the New York revival of Lee Blessing's *Two Rooms*, directed by Peter Flynn, for a limited Off-Broadway engagement at the Lion Theatre at Theatre Row (410 West 42nd Street), beginning October 2nd. **Opening Night is set for Tuesday, October 7th (7 PM),**

Two Rooms will star **Adinah Alexander** (*Adding Machine, Parade*), **Patrick Boll** (Coen Brothers' *Burn After Reading* with George Clooney and Brad Pitt), **Angela Christian** (*Woman in White, Thoroughly Modern Millie*), and **Michael Milligan** (*Thom Pain*).

Two Rooms tells the tale of one man's captivity by kidnappers and the roller-coaster ride of hope and frustration his wife endures half a world away. *Two Rooms* will have scenic design by Kevin Judge, lighting design by Thom Weaver, costume design by Jennifer Caprio, and sound design by Scott Stauffer.

Lee Blessing's play *A Walk In The Woods* was produced on Broadway and London's West End. His Off-Broadway productions include *A Body Of Water*, Primary Stages; *Going To St. Ives*, Primary Stages (Outer Critic's Circle Award, Best Play, Obie for ensemble performance); *Thief River*, Signature Theatre (Drama Desk nomination, Best Play); *Cobb*, Lucille Lortel Theatre (Drama Desk award, best ensemble); *Chesapeake*, New York Stage and Film at Second Stage; *Eleemosynary*, Manhattan Theatre Company and *Down The Road*, the Weissberger Group at the Atlantic Theatre. The Signature Theatre dedicated its 1992-93 season to his work, consisting of *Fortinbras*, *Lake Street Extension*, *Two Rooms* and the world premiere of *Patient A*. Recent world and regional premieres of his work include an adaptation of Thornton Wilder's *Heaven's My Destination* scheduled for world premiere by the Cleveland Play House in Spring 2009, *Great Falls* in the 2008 Humana New Play Festival of the Actors Theatre of Louisville, *A Body Of Water* at the Guthrie Theater and the Old Globe Theatre, *Lonesome Hollow*, *Flag Day* and *Whores* at the Contemporary American Theatre Festival, *The Scottish Play* at La Jolla Playhouse, *Black Sheep* at Florida Stage and *The Winning Streak* at George Street Playhouse. Other plays include *Independence*, *Riches*, *Oldtimers Game*, *Nice People Dancing To Good Country Music* and *Perilous Night*. Productions of Blessing's plays have earned awards such as The American Theater Critics Circle Award, the L.A. Drama Critics Award, The Great American Play Award, The Humanitas Award and the George and Elisabeth Marton Award, among others. He has received nominations for Tony and Olivier awards, as well as the Pulitzer Prize.

Peter Flynn was recently named the new Artistic Director of the Hangar Theatre in Ithaca, New York. Broadway: Actors' Fund concerts of *On the 20th Century*, *Chess*, and *Funny Girl*. Off-Broadway: *Henry & Mudge*, & *Junie B. Jones* (nominated for two Lucille Lortel Awards including Best Musical), and *Rhapsody in Seth* starring Seth Rudetsky. Other New York credits: *Romulus*, a new opera - Guggenheim Museum, *The Broadway Musicals of 1953* - Town Hall, and *Babes in Toyland* - Avery Fisher Hall. Angela Christian was most recently seen as Cherie in *Bus Stop* at the Rubicon Theatre in Ventura, CA. Prior to that she played the title role in the Off-Broadway premiere of *Anais Nin: One of Her Lives*. She made her West End debut creating the title role in *The Woman In White*, directed by Trevor Nunn, which she then reprised on Broadway.
